GUIDELINES FOR PARENTS SHARED TO SUPPORT YOUNG CHILDREN IN CONTINUING PRACTICE IN READING AND MATHS TO REINFORCE LEARNING:

GUIDELINES FOR ENHANCING INTEREST IN READING:

- Encourage oral-aural skills.
- Read stories and poems to children and ask them to read it back to you.
- Encourage them to read stories and listen to poetry. Let them read it out or recite it in front of you.
- Surround children with reading materials.
- Encourage wide variety of reading activities.
- Encourage them to look up for new words from the dictionary daily and make sentences with them later on.
- Encourage "Reading Circles".
- Help them choose age-appropriate books.
- Let them read the genres they are interested in.
- Encourage them to frame stories and compose poems on their own. Appreciate their creativity.
- Teach them phonemic awareness.
- Listen to when your child read stories or recite poems to you.
 Appreciate them.

- Ask them reflective questions after reading stories or poems.
- Make them e-library members and encourage them to read e -books or listen to audio books. Ask them to repeat what they have read or heard.
- Encourage creative writing.
- Make reading a regular activity at home.

GUIDELINES FOR ENHANCING INTEREST IN MATHMATICS:

- Help children in understanding mathematical concepts.
- Help them to refresh memory of forgotten concepts at regular intervals.
- Encourage children to practice "Mental Maths". This helps reinforce concepts quickly.
- Encourage them to find and identify different shapes in their surroundings to encourage geometric knowledge.
- Encourage them to tackle more than just assigned problems.
- Connect maths with real-life situations for better understanding.
- Try math drills and flash cards to encourage speed calculations.
- Encourage them to read word problems aloud. Make them repeat and draw pictures for each problem.

- Encourage the use of "Number Line" at home and it will reinforce what is being taught in classroom. It will help children be independent in thinking about numbers.
- Practice sample sums before approaching the assignments.
- Parents need to familiarize themselves with the learning standards of the child.
- Sit and solve math home-works together.
- Help them pay attention to details.
- Play "Math Games" at home.

ENCOURAGE READING AND MATH PRACTICE EVERYDAY. USE POSITIVE REINFORCEMENT WHILE ENCOURAGING THEM AS IT HELPS CHILDREN TO ASSIMILATE THE GOOD BEHAVIOURS. BE POSITIVE TOWARDS THE CHILD'S EDUCATION.
